COMMENTARY: A flagrant PERSONAL foul occurs when the ball is live and the penalty for a single flagrant personal foul is the ejection of the offender, two free throws to the offended team and a throw-in to the offended team at a designated spot nearest to where the foul occurred. This throw-in spot is similar to the throw-in spot for a single personal foul. Play is resumed at the point of interruption to the offended team for a single flagrant TECHNICAL foul.

COMMENTARY: When the ball is placed at the disposal of A6 for the free throw, the game has begun and all substitution rules apply. A player is never required to remain in a game unless she is shooting free throws or she is the designated jumper. There are rules restricting the return of a player but only those rules previously mentioned restrict a player from leaving the game.

COMMENTARY: As the question is stated, only answer 'a' can be correct. However, for both 'a' and 'b' to be correct (option 'd'), the question should have stated only a "technical foul" (not an "administrative technical foul"). Administrative technical fouls are not assessed to bench personnel. When bench personnel enter the playing court, they shall be assessed a Bench technical foul, not an Administrative technical foul.
